Vicar's Viewpoint ...

Banking plays a key part

T STILL seems strange to have the Archbishop of Canterbury as one of the members of the Parliamentary Commission for Banking Standards whose report is due in the next few weeks.

But Archbishop Welby knows what he is talking about when he argues for British banks to be recapitalised, broken up and staffed with professional workers. The UK is in a 'depression', he said, and it will take 'something very, very major to get out of it'.

For banking as we all now know has a key part to play in the life of our nation with an influence far beyond the economy. The lives of real people are directly affected, even ruined, when banks are not properly functioning.

Just ask any young people in Spain how their lives have been damaged, possibly irreparably, through bad banking.

In all this Archbishop Welby makes clear his main objective: "My key mission is to lead the Church in worshipping Jesus Christ



and encouraging people to believe in him and follow him. That's my mission."

For the cross of Jesus makes the astonishing claim that his sacrificial death is for all people, irrespective of any category we may chose to impose.

Even as he breathed his last the curtain of the Jerusalem temple was torn in two from top to bottom. This was a vivid demonstration that all barriers, everything that would separate us from God and from each other, are now destroyed.

For now the risen Christ is acclaimed as Lord of all before whom every knee shall bow. There can be no one or nothing beyond his authority. And that includes the full financial sector.

The Bible does not allow us to separate life into the spiritual (which is very important) and the ordinary (which is mundane and somehow beneath God's dignity). We stand before God as complete individuals; you cannot compartmentalize the spiritual.

For the victorious Christ would gladly assume responsibility for any life surrendered to him. He longs to be directly involved in each area of our life, however we may have wronged him, such is his amazing grace. And every area of our life means just that, everything.

Such is his over Ross Mong Uir whelming love.

ORMSKIRK Foodbank is now formally established with a constitution and a bank account and we are in partnership with the Trussell Trust ~ a national charity that has setup over 300 foodbanks in the UK.

West Lancashire Debt Advice

THIS new church-led debt advice service was formally inaugurated last month by the Bishop of Warrington and by the Mayor and Mayoress of West Lancashire. This is a free service run by specially-trained volunteers from local churches, offering confidential advice and support three times a week.

Along with St John's church in Burscough, members of Christ Church have been offering some simple money management courses. However, visiting St Andrew's Clubmoor church, in Liverpool, to see their debt advice service showed the potential of Ormskirk churches working together as part of a network of over 100 advice centres overseen by Christian charity Community Money Advice.
