Vicar's Viewpoint ...

'Changed by the Holy Spirit'

"I used to have a motto: If anyone ever beats me, I have to kill them. Life was all about your name"

Shane Taylor

WHEN Shane Taylor was eventually arrested, there were 12 armed officers and 60 regulars. He was sentenced to 12-and-a-half years for what was then the largest ever known importation of cannabis to the UK.

By no means a model prisoner. In fact, he had a further four years added to his sentence for violence against prison officers and was designated a Category A prisoner.

Taylor spent most of his days in segregation. For months at a time, his food would be delivered through a secure hatch in his door, and he would be escorted to the showers by officers in full riot gear.

The Home Office came to know him as one of the six most dangerous prisoners in the country.

One day an officer said he had to go to an educational class. It was a mistake and so he was directed to the chapel instead. As it happens he arrived during an Alpha course.

Taylor decided to stay for the free coffee and biscuits rather than the opportunity to learn about the Christian faith.

It was the message of God's

forgiveness grabbed him. "I had always thought there were good and bad people," he says. "I thought I was bad, so I was going to hell no matter what I did."

So this hardened criminal prayed: "God, if you're real, come into my life, because I hate the way I am."

God did ~ and Taylor became a changed man, changed by the Holy Spirit.

For as he had thrown himself into violent crime, he now became all-out for Jesus. "People would mock me and I wouldn't care." In fact, he started to help run the Alpha courses in prison.

All this took place ten years ago. And Taylor is still helping run Alpha but now not just in prisons. In fact, he is coming to Christ Church to speak at the launch of our 50th Alpha course.

This takes place on **Thursday, 5 October at 8.00pm** in our Ministry Centre. Wine and canapés are being served.

If God can change someone like Shane Taylor, he can change anyone. As the apostle Paul rejoices: "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Corinthians 5:17)

The great adventure ~ our Alpha launch

SHANE Taylor was once classed as one of the most dangerous prisoners in Britain. Imprisoned for drug running, kidnap and attempted murder, his out-of-control behaviour quickly saw him transferred to a high security prison.

Even then he needed further locking up and was placed within a close supervision system. Shane says, 'They felt I was a danger to everybody. They had to feed me through a hatch in the door, because they couldn't have physical contact with me.'

Shane tried Alpha and his life was transformed.

How we found Alpha

KAREN and Greg were two of the people who did our Alpha course last year. They share their experiences:

Karen: "I started on my Alpha journey about ten years ago, unfortunately I became ill and couldn't finish the course.

"I restarted my journey last year and have learnt a great deal. During the process, I have made some good friends and questioned a lot about myself and my life. I feel like I am only just beginning on a new chapter.

"The course has been refreshing, interesting, questioning and informative. The concept of having a meal together, watching DVD's, then debating differing viewpoints for a couple of hours a week is excellent. I have a long way to go, but I hope this is only just the start for me."

Greg writes: "I have never been a believer, perhaps more of an atheist, living life how I want and happy to take what ever my fate shall

be. Being ex-military, I had been in a couple of dangerous situations and at the time thought it was game over for me, but I always managed to survive.

"During my years I have had a couple of God moments when I have thought, was that divine intervention or just coincidence. Coincidence I put it down to, nothing more, but in the back of my mind, I had always wondered.

"Then one day a friend invited me to Alpha and mentioned a free meal. Well, you have got me, I was never one to pass a free meal.

"I have now completed Alpha and moved on to several other courses and now see those who took the course as friends.

"I'm knocking on God's door but not quite ready to step inside. It's not an easy journey; you will look and question yourself. Take some things on board and the ones you can't put on a shelf until you can re-visit them.

"My journey will continue for now, but I would ask anyone thinking of joining Alpha to at least try it."
